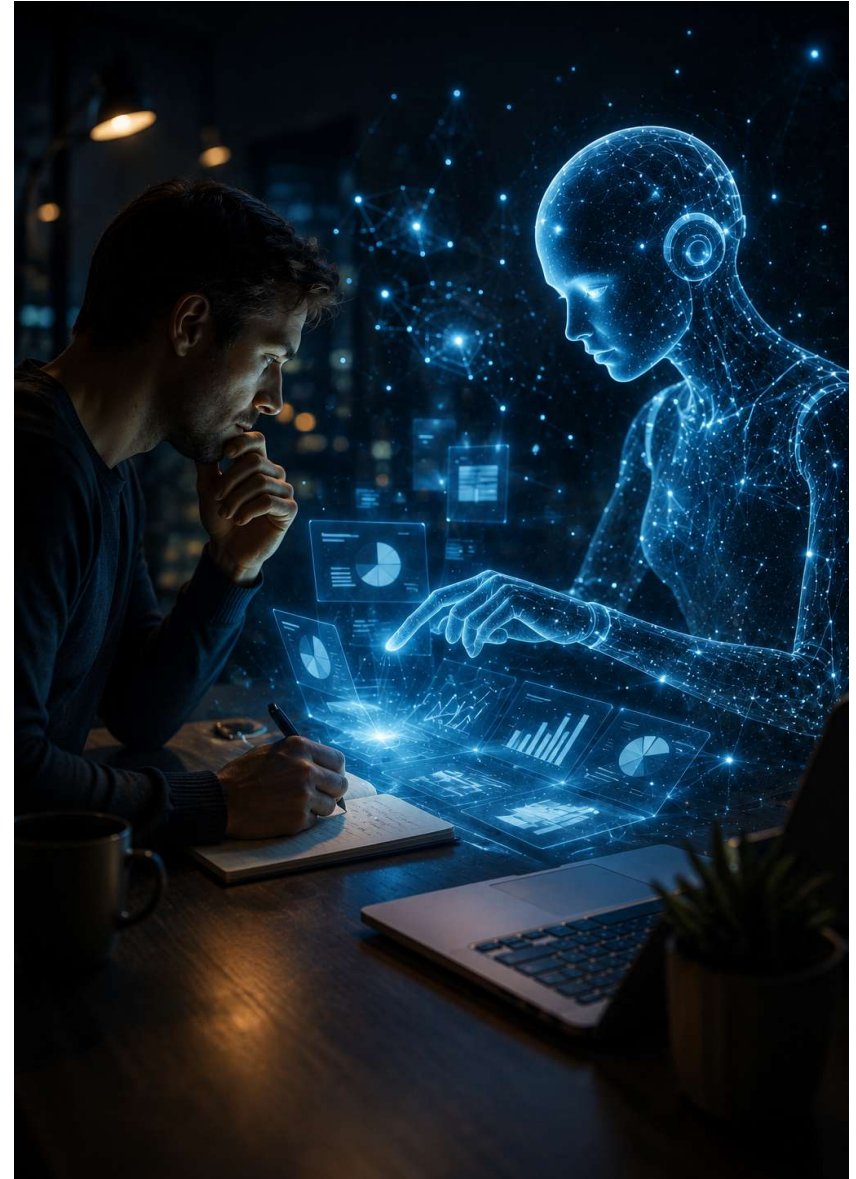

- Supported by best practice & standards



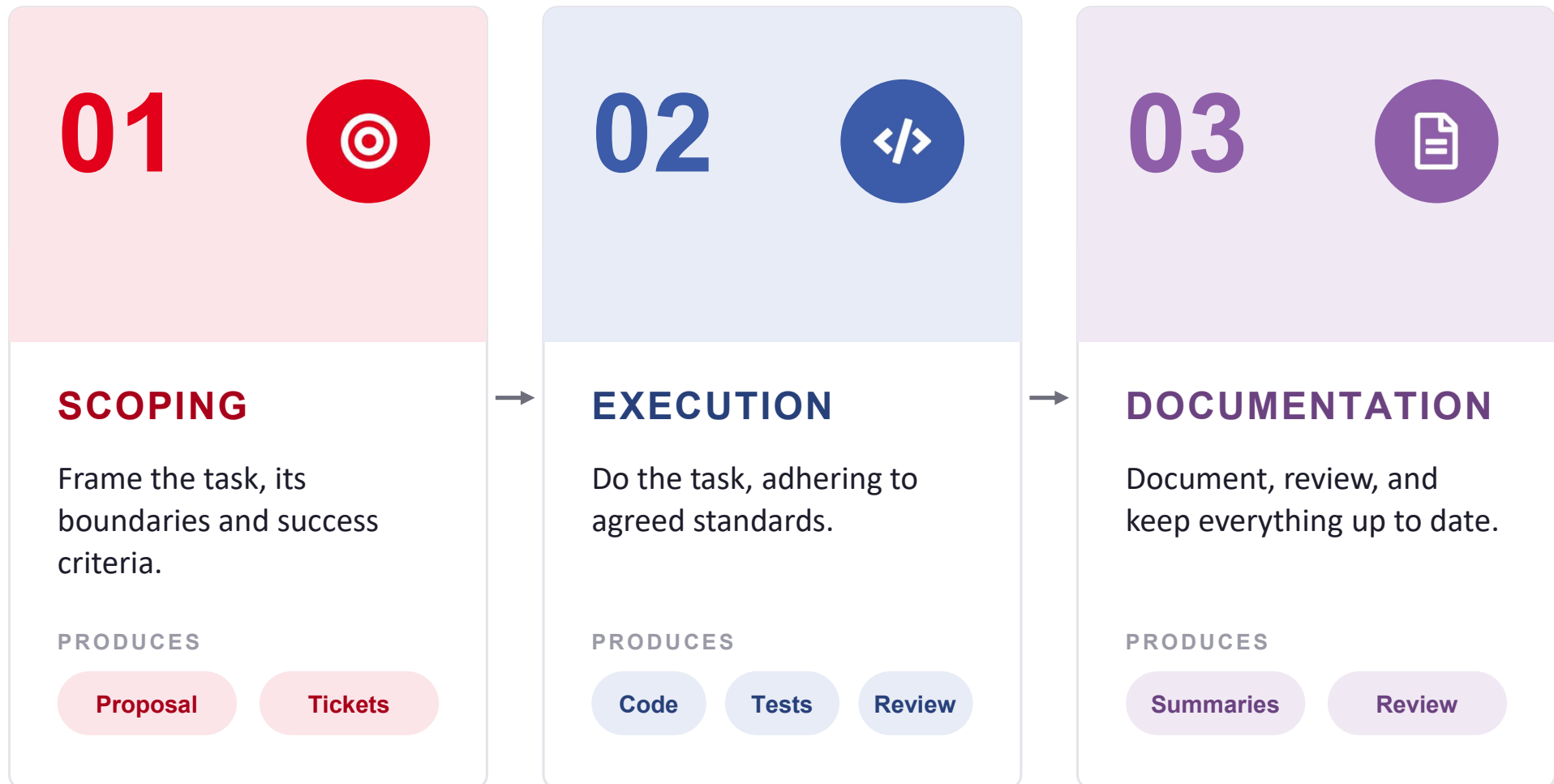
What this is not

- Replacing accountability

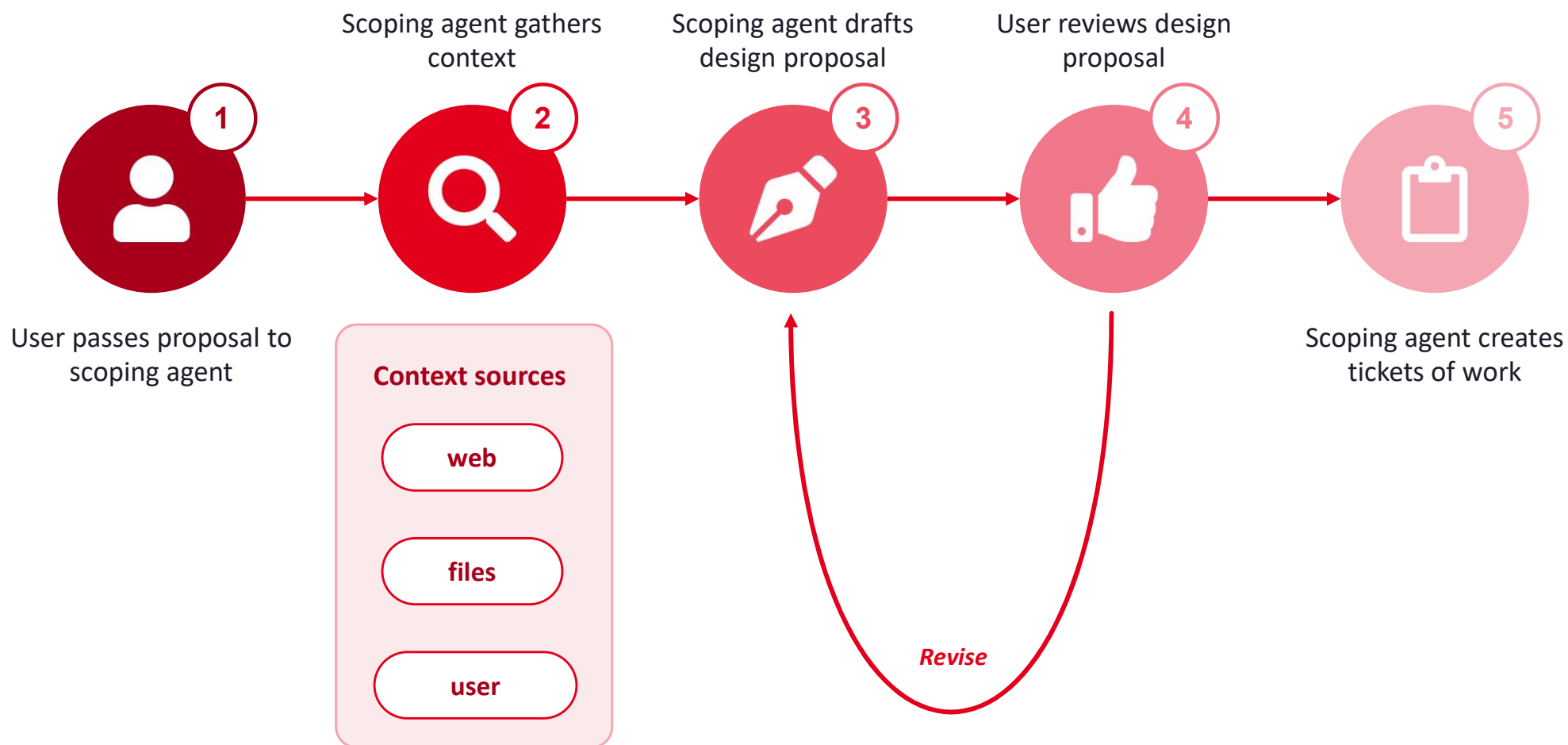


Design principle make the routine work easier to run, review and improve.

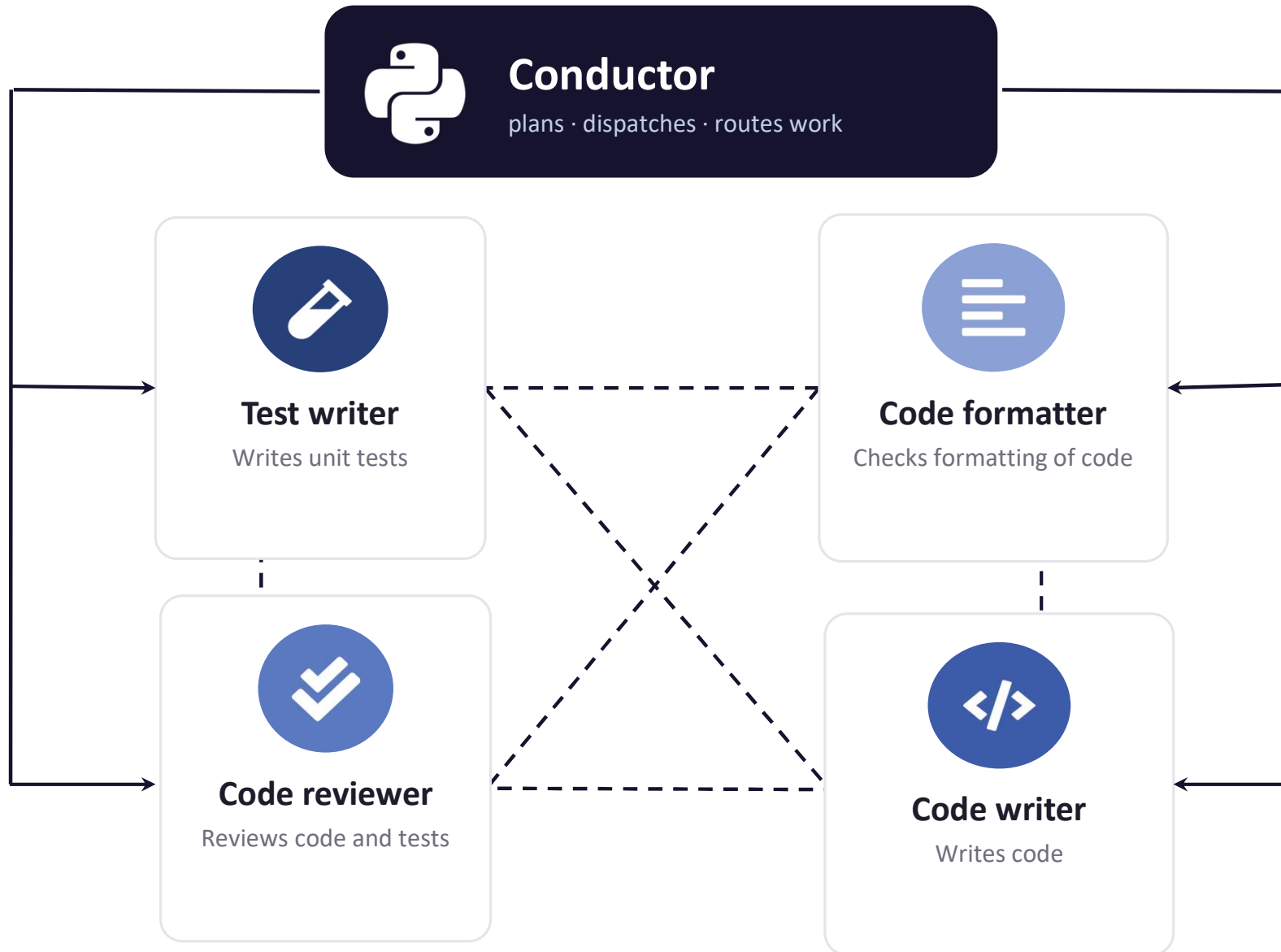


Stage 1 — Scoping



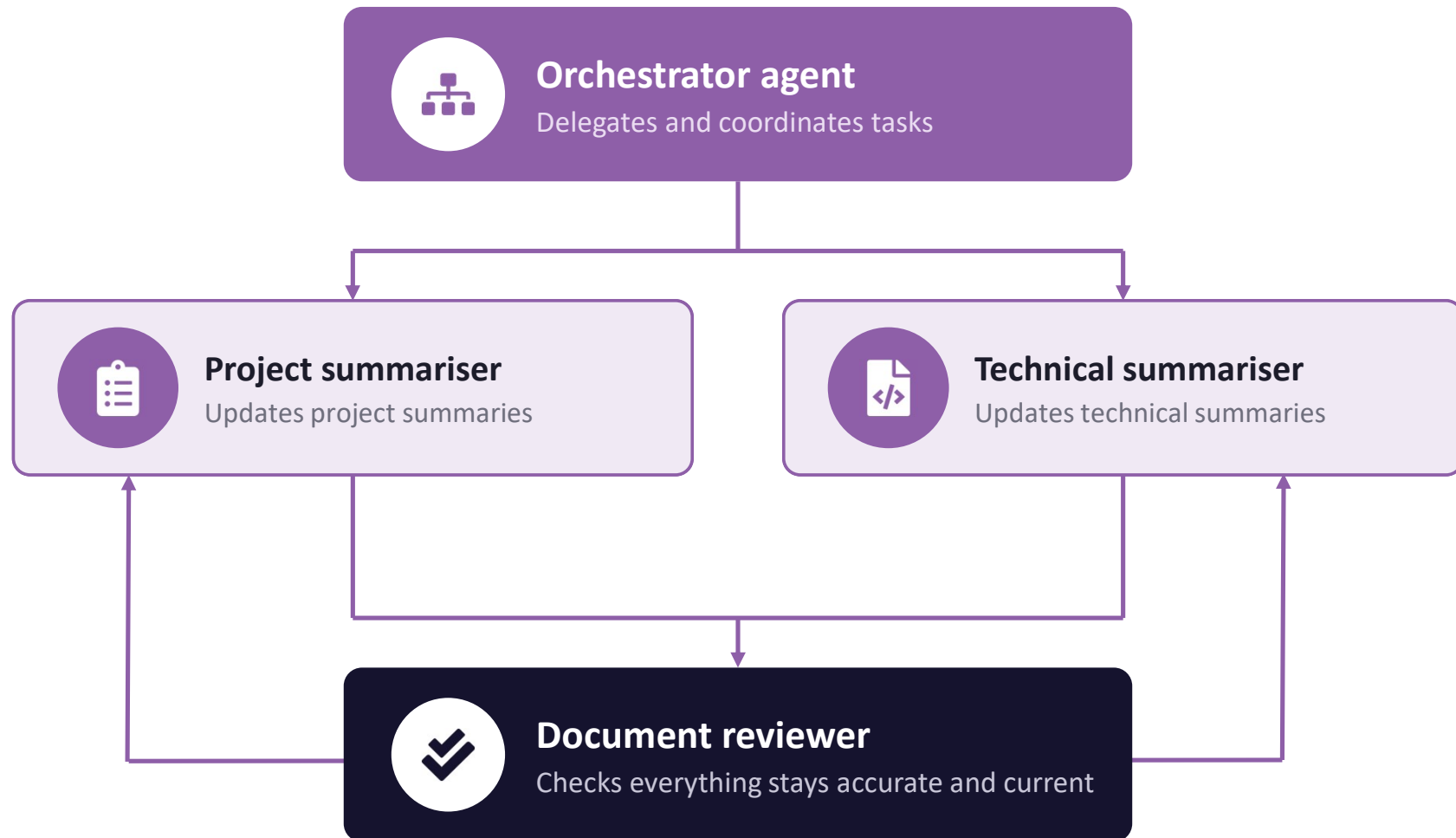


Stage 2 — Execution

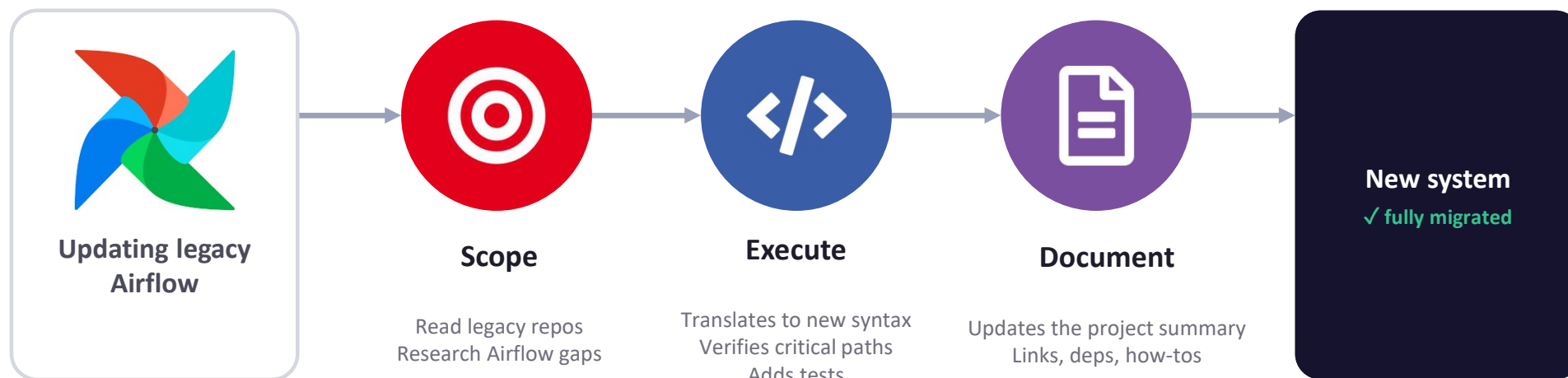


The common thread automation still needs explicit standards, roles and review points.
